## 'Cornouailles' joins the cauliflower run

IT IS JUST over four years ago that a group of Beston farmers got together to find a way of transporting their produce to the UK faster and cheaper. This was the beginning of Brittany Ferries. Previously Breton produce had been transported several hundred miles by land to the traditional cross-Channel ports of France and then across to the UK, the produce (mainly muliflowers and other vegetables) often arriving in pror condition. It was then that the farmers decided to do something themselves, they built their own port at Roscoff and seat out tenders for a year-round shipping service. But mobody took up the offer so the French farmers decided to set up their own service and launched Brittany Ferries. The major shareholder in Brittany Ferries parent company, BAL is the Commit Economique de Fruits et Legumes de Bretagns.
